## 2023-2024 SPEAKER SERIES: TAKE ALL THE RIGHT MOVES FOR HEALTH & SAFETY



Carrie Pasquarello provided insight on travel safety, both here and abroad

St. James NEST's Speaker Series **Take All the Right Moves for Health and Safety** continues to be well-received by the St. James community. Our 3rd program in the series was **Strategizing Your Travel Safety.** Carrie Pasquarello, CEO and Co-Founder of Global Secure Resources spoke to us about travel safety essentials. On March 19th we held the 4th program in the series, *Taking Steps to Minimize Cancer Risks for Yourself and Your Family.* Sarah Davis, an Oncology RN from Hope Abounds Network, discussed the genetic component of cancer and when genetic screening might be appropriate for you or a family member. Hope Abounds Executive Director Elizabeth Barnes also provided information about services Hope Abounds can provide cancer patients and their family members. The final program in the series *The Importance of Food Choices as We Age* is Tuesday, May 21, 3-4:30 pm at the Community Center. Janice Shannon, a licensed nutritionist, will explain why the dietary choices we make now become even more important as we age and the role that these choices play in how we feel and engage with life. Janice will discuss the challenges that can exist when trying to eat foods that support a healthy lifestyle. She will discuss what the focus should be as well as foods that build us up and which ones can tear us down.
